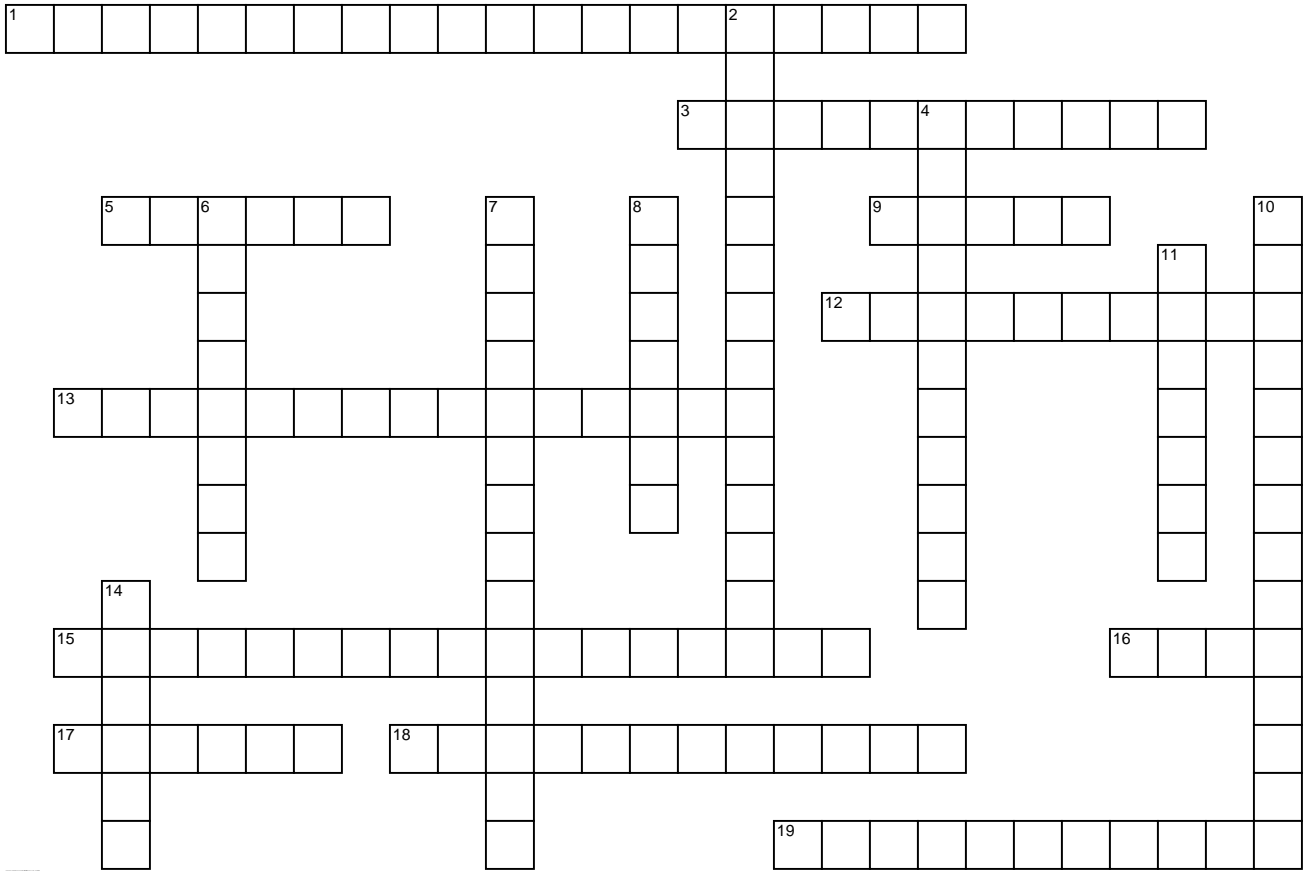

- 17 President who saw the beginning of the Great Depression, and did little to stop it
