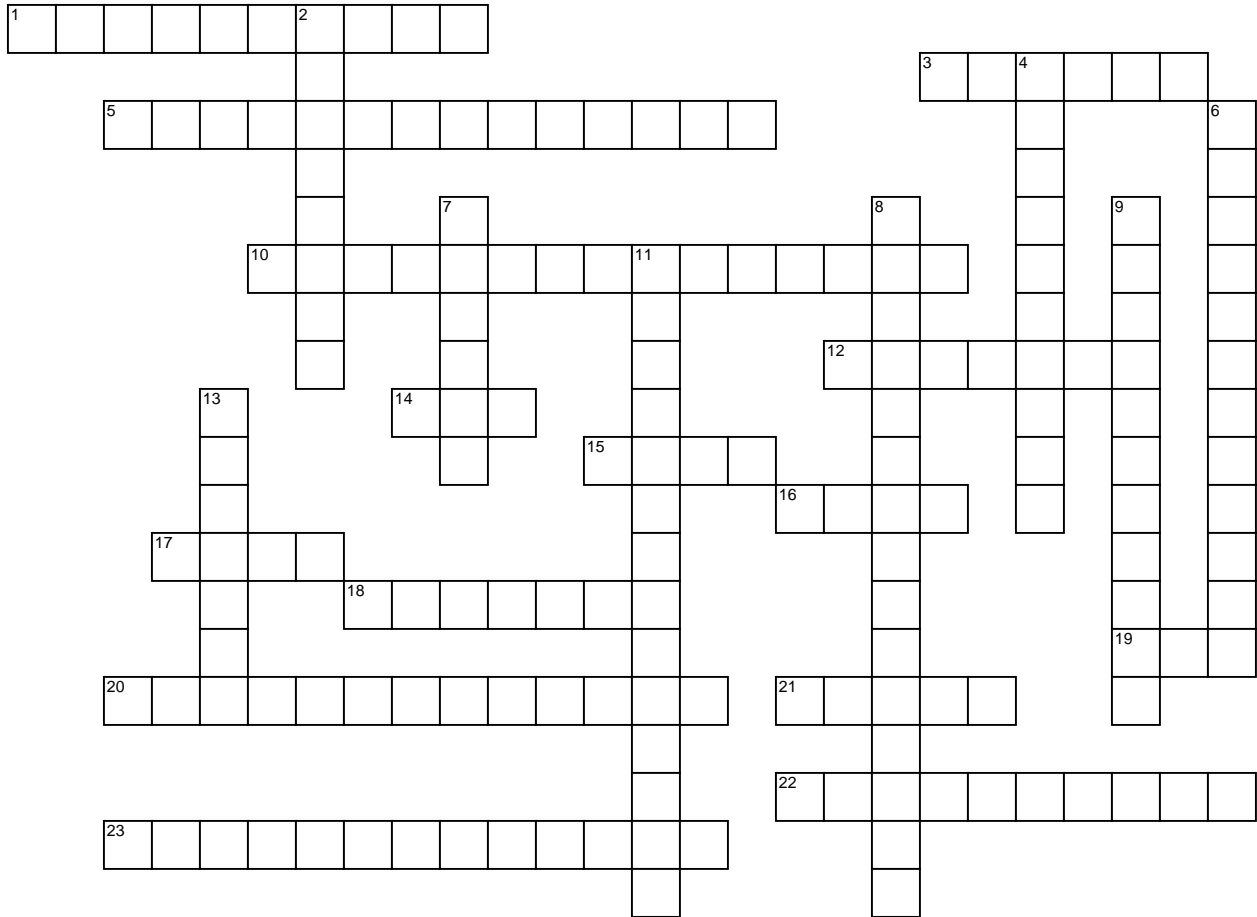

- 1 City where the famous bus boycott took place
- 3 Figure who led a powerful non-violent resistance to British colonial rule in India, which resulted in independence
- 5 Landmark law passed in 1964 that outlawed racial or sexual discrimination in public services and employment
- 10 Landmark case in favor of "separate but equal"
- 12 Laws that enforced segregation
- 14 One of the great leaders of the civil rights movement, who advocated Christian principles
- 15 Religious pilgrimage to Mecca that Muslims are to make at least once in their lifetime, if possible
- 16 Warren Chief justice of the Supreme Court during Brown v. Board
- 17 Atlanta-based organization that staged sit-ins and other non-violent protests

- 18 Critical thinker and American philosopher who advocated civil disobedience when laws are unjust
- 19 Assassinator of MLK
- 20 American religious / political organization whose goal is to improve the condition of black people
- 21 Impoverished mostly-black neighborhood of L.A. that staged a violent 6-day riot in 1965
- 22 A movement that achieved prominence in the 1960's and 70's that advocated generally for the improvement of the status of black people, and fought against cultural assimilation
- 23 Famous jazz singer who sang the political tune "Strange Fruit"

DOWN

- 2 Fervent civil rights advocate who favored segregation in order for blacks to educated and discipline themselves,

- enfranchise their own businesses and communities to cut dependency on the white man
- 4 Prestigious award given for great contributions to humankind; awarded to Dr. King in 1964
- 6 Johnson's optimistic domestic agenda, which included a civil rights bill
- 7 Assassinator of JFK
- 8 Passed in 1965, this legislative act helped to enfranchise black voters
- 9 Landmark case that ruled separate but equal was unconstitutional in schools
- 11 Leader of the Nation of Islam who was said to be the messenger of Allah. Originally close to Malcolm X, the two eventually grew apart.
- 13 Voluntarily abstaining from using a product or service in protest; the African-American community in Montgomery did this with busses
